Prepackaged Products

Through the incorporation of various censuses and surveys to the basis of statistical data of the IBGE, it became possible to honor requests for information in the form of Special Tabulations, defined in function of the needs of the user. These services, although of great usefulness, are not exempt from omissions: the processing costs as well as the length of time for production can reduce considerably its range of utilization.

For the purpose of establishing a faster and less costly service for our users, three types of files were initially created: aggregates, samples and themes.

Aggregates are the files that contain aggregated information at a determined minimum geographic level, of greater use at the IBGE and in the research community in general.

Samples are the files produced through a process of selection of observations by sampling.

Themes are the files that contain information about specific topics using special aggregates.

These files, thusly classified, are available to users under the denomination of Prepackaged Products. Some files that do not fit in the aggregate, sample or theme modalities can also be included as prepackaged products as long as general interest justifies it.
